Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The responsorial psalm this weekend is the beautiful and well-known, Psalm 23, The Lord is My Shepherd. The sentiments of this psalm offer comfort, encouragement, and security in knowing God is with you. I invite you to keep this psalm close to you and to reflect on it each day, preferably each morning as you start your day — to reassure you that God is with you in whatever it is you must do and whatever it is you will face.
