Fr. Martin's Reflection - 10/03/21 Bulletin

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our readings for this weekend are a call to pause and reflect on the cause of our existence. The Book of Genesis gives us two creation stories. The first tells us how God created all the world and all the creatures in it, and then created humanity. In the second creation story, the one we hear in today's readings, God creates man and then creates all the other creatures for him, to help fulfil or complete him. All the creatures God creates are wonderful to the man, but they don't complete him, they are not his help mate – they don't touch his soul. Then God has a 'eureka,' moment and realizes that the only thing that can truly fulfil or touch the soul of humanity is humanity itself. God takes from the man a part of man and creates woman. This is a beautiful image of man and woman being of the one bone, and the one flesh, forever connected and equal, both created in the image and likeness of God. This is our beginning, our genesis story. We are equal and created in the image and likeness of God. I believe, for us to truly understand and appreciate the dignity of all human beings, we must first accept and believe that we were created by God and in the image and likeness of God.
