"Teacher, this woman was caught in the very act of committing adultery. Now in the law, Moses commanded us to stone such women. So what do you say?"

"Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

"Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"

"No one sir."

"Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."
