Fr. Martin's Reflection – June 5, 2022

Dear Sisters and Brothers.

On this great weekend of Pentecost, may you open your heart to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit:

Wisdom: In the gift of wisdom, we see God at work in our lives and in the world. Wisdom enables us to see God in everyone and everything everywhere.

Understanding: We comprehend how we need to live as a follower of Christ. It is the gift whereby self-evident principles are known.

Counsel (Right Judgement): With the gift of counsel/right judgement, we know the difference between right and wrong, and we choose to do what is right.

Fortitude (Courage): With the gift of fortitude/courage, we overcome our fear and are willing to take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Knowledge: With the gift of knowledge, we understand the meaning of God. The gift of knowledge is more than an accumulation of facts.

Piety (Reverence): With the gift of piety/reverence, we have a deep sense of respect for God and the church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before God with humility, trust, and love.

Fear of the Lord (Wonder and Awe): With the gift of fear of the Lord we are aware of the glory and majesty of God. A person with wonder and awe knows that God is the perfection of all we desire: perfect knowledge, perfect goodness, perfect power, and perfect love.

On Friday, June 3, and Sunday, June 5, our young women and men of the 8th Grade received the Sacrament of Confirmation. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate them and wish them every success and best wishes for the future, I also want to remind them that there is always a place for them at Mary, Mother of the Church Parish. I pray that you don't see the Sacrament of Confirmation as the means to an end – end of Religious Ed, the end of early rising on a Sunday morning, or the giving up of my Tuesdays, or the end of me having to go to Mass.
