

Fr. Martin's Reflection – May 22, 2022

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we all know, it is so very hard to say goodbye to someone we love. May they be moving to another part of the world or leaving this world to go to God. In this period following the resurrection, Jesus is preparing his followers for his imminent departure, but what is crucial, he reassures them that he is not going to leave them alone, abandoned, or without them feeling his continued presence.

Jesus reminds his disciples of the importance of reflecting on the 'word' he gave them, and to live a life of love. Jesus knew that his followers would have to endure struggles, and if they reflected on his word and practiced each day the gift of love, this would enable them to face the struggles of this world. Jesus was also aware that some of these struggles would be difficult and sometimes divisive. To help them with these difficulties he promised to send them the Advocate – the Holy Spirit.
