Fr. Martin's Reflection – November 6, 2022

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Christmas is coming! I can't believe I have written those words; it just seems so far away and yet the last Sunday in November is the first Sunday of Advent. I mention this now because times like Advent are inclined to creep up on us and even though we have promised ourselves that this year we would be better prepared for Christmas, spiritually, we need to start preparing now. This time of the year our days are shorter, our nights longer. We have so much to do, gifts to buy, decorations to go up, school plays to attend, or staff parties to go to. Then Christmas Day arrives, and we say, so much for been spiritually prepared for Christmas.

So, how does one spiritually prepare? By demanding personal time for you and God. Finding a quiet place, learning to sit for a while, breathing, reading scripture, and sitting face to face with Jesus in the Eucharist.

Jesus said to his disciples: **"Come away by yourselves to a desolate place and rest awhile."** (Mk 6:31) Why? Because the world can be a very busy, noisy, and time-consuming place. Jesus is concerned for us. We will have the opportunity to speak to Jesus, say exactly what is in our hearts and on our minds. We can take the missalette and reflect on the up-coming Sunday readings or sit and listen to the soft music and just breathe.

To make this all possible I need to be assured that there will always be someone present in the church while the Blessed Sacrament is present on the altar. So, I have outlined a time frame from 1pm - 7pm for the four Wednesdays of Advent.
