## Fr. Martin's Reflection – April 30, 2023

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last weekend, we celebrated First Holy Communion for our 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade students. It was a wonderful celebration, and the boys and girls were so excited and so well prepared. I want to take this opportunity to thank Margaret Zola, our Religious Education Coordinator, our 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade teachers and to you, the parents, for preparing our young people for this wonderful and beautiful sacrament of First Holy Communion. Let us forever keep them in our hearts and prayers.

On May 10th, our 8<sup>th</sup> Graders will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, a sacrament equally beautiful to First Holy Communion, and yet very different.
