Fr. Martin's Reflection – May 28, 2023

Dear Sister and Brothers,

The first reading for the Sunday of Pentecost from the Acts of the Apostles is dramatic and descriptive. The image of tornedo-like winds, windows flying open, dust swirling all around and then this sense of peacefulness descends on all gathered, filling them with hope and courage – a courage that inspires you to reach out to others and share with them what God gives. People were amazed at the giftedness of the disciples – their ability to communicate with all people from all different backgrounds and social standings, people with different languages and different cultural traditions. The gift of the Holy Spirit, the gift Jesus promised the disciples was a gift that could reach all and was meant for all.
