### Fr. Martin's Reflection – November 12, 2023

# O God, you are my God whom I seek; for you my flesh pines and my soul thirsts like the earth, parched, lifeless and without water. Ps 63:1

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Psalm 63 makes clear whom we should seek and why. We can fill our days with all kinds of things; some things will be very creative and productive and will bring some joy and happiness, but that joy and happiness will pass, and we will have to find something else to fill that void. The Psalmist clearly tells us that our spiritual selves will only find fulfilment and contentment in God. Without God our lives will become like the earth without water, parched and lifeless. Like water nourishes the earth, God nourishes us. Like all health programs some of us need some help, maybe something out of the ordinary, something that we can ask a friend or family member to join us in, something that is different, something that we must make a conscious decision to attend.
