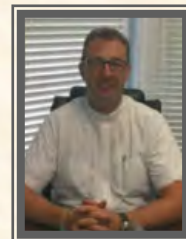


**Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for June 2024
For Those Fleeing Their Country**

We pray for migrants fleeing wars or hunger, forced into journeys full of danger and violence, that they would find acceptance and new life opportunities in their host countries.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On June 26 I will have the honor of celebrating my 30th anniversary of ordination to God's priesthood. I find it so strange thinking 30 years have passed, and in all it has been a wonderful 30 years. There have been difficulties and challenges a long the way, but God has always been strong and has given me the strength and faith I have needed at those times. When something was beyond me, something that I knew I was unable to do or manage, God would send me a 'Simon of Cyrene.'



I have to say, from the get-go I was a reluctant disciple. I was living and working in New York. Life was good, skiing in the winter, beach in the summer, and a little work in between to pay the bills. Then God changed all that. Over the next 30 years there were a whole lot of 'I don't want to do,' things that I found myself doing. I didn't want to study for the priesthood in Ireland, I studied in Ireland. I didn't want to teach after ordination, I taught for 8 years in High School. Yet, there were many exciting adventures too. I led the team that established Youth Ministry in my home diocese, organizing and leading youth groups on pilgrimages all over the world. After 23 years of priesthood I'm thinking I'll get a quiet parish and sail off into the twilight. No, God decides that there is another adventure God wants me to go on, go to America. Did this surprise me? Yes. Did it surprise family and friends? Yes. Some even thought I was a little crazy as I was approaching 50 and had spent all my priestly life in Ireland, why go to the US? The only answer I had was, God wanted it.

I say all this, not to promote the book that I'll never write, but to highlight the greatness of God. What God has done with me and through me has simply amazed me. When I sit down on June 26 and reflect on the 30 years God has given me as a priest and the amazing and blessed life I have had, I pray for God's continued blessing. A big part of this blessed life has been the people God has blessed me with. Your prayers, support, and encouragement have been sustaining food for the journey. Thank you for all your love, prayers, and support.

May God bless you and guide you always, and don't ever be afraid to say yes to God, God will do things with you that you never thought were possible and fill you with such joy that you never thought was achievable. God's love is everything.

Volunteers are always needed! Please consider volunteering for our Religious Education program. We have a wonderful program for Catechists, Aides and Hall Monitors. The success of our program is dependent on the willingness of individuals. All volunteers need to be fingerprinted and attend a "VIRTUS" Safe Child workshop before being allowed to volunteer. (Fingerprinting and VIRTUS information can be found on our website.) Volunteering is a rewarding experience to share your faith with our parish youth.

SHIPS AND SAILORS GAME

Ships and Sailors is a fun, fast-paced game. Players follow nautical-themed commands, like "Captain's coming" or "Man overboard." The game helps with memory and listening skills and is great for large groups. It can be played indoors or outdoors. This game fits well with a discussion based on the Gospel for this weekend (Mark 4:35-41), where Jesus calms the storm, teaching about faith and trust.

Ships and Sailors is a game where one player gives commands and the others must follow them. A little like Simon Says, except with a nautical theme. It requires some memory and listening skills, so it works best for middle school and older. Start with a few commands and then throw more in the mix as the sailors learn them. You might find it helpful to have a printed list of the commands. Some of the commands require the sailors to get in a group, forcing some people to be out. So this game moves along pretty quickly. Enjoy!

Instructions

1. Choose one player to be the captain. Everyone else is a sailor.
2. The captain calls out a command and all of the sailors must do it as the captain counts to 3 to 5 seconds (or even more for younger players) and then says "Halt!"
3. Any player who has not completed the action when the captain says halt is out. Play continues till 1 player or small team remain.

Examples of commands

- Captain's coming: Stand up straight and salute. Don't move until the captain says "At ease".
- Sail west: everyone runs to the right side of the playing area.
- Sail east: everyone runs to the left side of the playing area.
- Pirates: everyone moves to the front of the playing area.
- No pirates: everyone moves to the back of the playing area.

The Perfect Storm

I am writing this on a Saturday morning. Saturdays are my writing days, when my husband takes over the kids and the house and I disappear into the office with an enormous cup of coffee and noise-canceling headphones. Saturdays are sacred — if work can be called sacred.

But Saturday morning is also the only time I'm able to consistently get to confession. Every other time the sacrament is offered in my area during the week, I seem to have unavoidable commitments — but on Saturday morning, all I have is work, and how can I let work come before a sacrament, as much as I might secretly want to?

I've spent a good deal of time being bitter about this, because it's just not convenient, having to carve out time from work to run to the other side of town, especially when I get there and there's a line. I sit there in the sanctuary, waiting my turn, checking the clock, stewing, fretting. Obsessing over forgetting one of my sins. Thinking of how much work I have when I get home.

Saturday mornings: *a perfect storm*, I sometimes call it in my head.

I forge ahead, though. I've never gotten up and dashed back to my desk. I make it into the confessional and I stammer out my pathetic little list and receive absolution. Then I go before the tabernacle to perform my penance.

It's while I am kneeling there that it happens. Always. God awakens, and he cries into the depths of my heart: "Quiet! Be still! Why are you terrified? Do you not yet have faith?"

After teaching all day by the shore of the sea, Jesus asks his disciples to remove him from the crowds. He wants to escape the noise, the clamor, the disquiet. But the clamor follows him, because the world is full of it. Storms crop up wherever we go.

Jesus sleeps through the storm, because he understands what the disciples do not: the storms of the world cannot hurt us. They are only so much noise.

"Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"
Mark 4:41



Inspiration for the Week

So often when we are weathering the storm, it feels like God is asleep — but we never even tried to wake Him up! Bring God your fears, your doubts, your uncertainties. He will show you that He steers the ship, and even the wind and the seas obey.

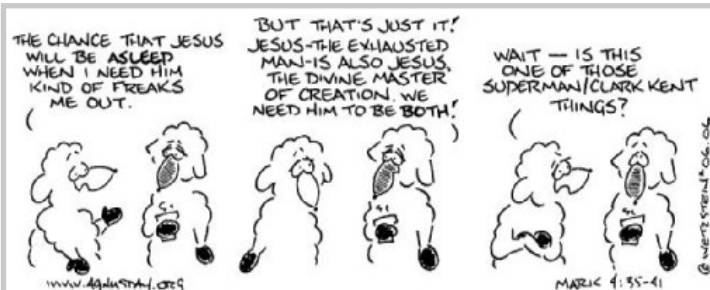
