



Dear Friends in Christ,

We have our first week of Advent behind us and are now heading into week two. What do you find is eating up all your time, and all your energy? What do the Christmas preparations looking like? Is the tree up, the lights on, gifts bought; and do you know who all are coming for Christmas dinner? Oh, I forgot to send Jane from my running group, a card for Christmas - I've still time.

All the above can make Christmas so stressful and frustrating, and wishing it was December 26th already. But truth be told, the above is not Christmas, it's secular life on steroids. Christmas is about slowing down, taking a breath, and reflecting on your life relationship with the Child Jesus, the man Jesus, the God Jesus, the one who truly loves us and cares for us. So, the question we need to ask ourselves this Christmas and every Christmas:

So, Jesus, how we doing?

How well do you know me, Jesus? Do you know what's happening at work? Do you know what's happening at home, between me and my parents, kids, siblings, my husband/wife? 





#### **ADVENT**

Advent is a time of waiting in the darkness. Try to be patient with the waiting times in your life, as Mary and Joseph waited for the birth of Jesus. As your family prepares for Christmas, keep Jesus in your mind and heart, as they did.

#### **POINSETTIA**

The flower of this month is the poinsettia, with its Christmas colors red and green. Red and green have special meaning. Green is a symbol of eternal life (as evergreens do not shed their leaves but stay green all winter) and red is the sign of Jesus' humanity, for, while truly God, he shares our flesh and blood forever.

#### **CHRISTMAS CONFESSIONS**


