



Pope's Prayer Intentions for December 2025 - For Christians Living Amidst War or Conflict

Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.



Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate what is known as, 'Gaudéte, rejoice!' because the Lord is near and the fourth Sunday of Lent says, 'Laetáre, lerúsalem, be joyful, Jerusalem, and all who love her!' because she herself is loved by the Lord. The first two weeks of Advent is a time of penance and clearing the mind, heart, and soul of all earthly distractions and sinfulness. The last two weeks is a time to prepare to 'rejoice,' and 'be joyful' because our Lord is coming.

Is it possible for us to get our heads around the idea that 'Our Lord' is coming? The challenge for all of us, especially for us who have seen many Christmases, is that the spirit of Christmas is lost on us. A common cry is 'how commercial' it has become. The message all around us seems to be spend, spend, spend. The challenge for us as Christians is to try and not get swallowed up in this commercialism and loose sight of what Christmas is truly about. The Knights of Columbus have a wonderful sign as you come off Crosswicks Street, and on my back porch stating: 'Keep Christ in Christmas.' For us to keep Christ in Christmas we first must ask, 'what does Christ's coming mean to me? Will his coming, or will I allow his coming, to have any impact on my life? Can I rejoice, can I be joyful and accept that I am loved by the Lord?

One of the saddest things I experience in confession is when people tell me that the sin they have committed is so unforgivable that not even God could forgive them – I quietly cry, I feel God's sadness. The birth of Jesus is a wonderful occasion, but the birth is only the beginning of the story, a story we all know that ended with Christ's suffering and death on the cross. Among the final words Jesus spoke were, 'Forgive them Father, they don't know what they do.' Think about it, these people physically brutalised Jesus and crucified him and he forgave them, could any sin we commit top that? Do not let anything that you have done keep you from experiencing God's love and compassion.

Another sad experience I have in confession is when people come and say I don't have any sins to confess. The only thought that comes to me is, who are you comparing your life to? I know confession is not just about telling our sins, it really is coming into the presence of God's love, to feel God's embrace, to experience God's compassion and allow God to affirm us with the words, 'I am your God, and you are my child.' I honestly believe if we are to fully experience and appreciate the 'Gaudéte' and 'Laetáre' of Christmas we need to remove the 'Stuff' that prevents us from rejoicing and truly experiencing the joy of Christ in our hearts and lives. Come to the wonderful sacrament of Reconciliation this Advent.

The Blessing of the Baby Jesus figure from your home nativity will take place at all the Masses on the weekend of December 20-21.





### FIRST PENANCE RETREAT

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Graders will have their *First Penance Retreat* on January 31 from 9:30-11:30am in St. Mary School. Reminders will be sent home. First Penance Retreat is for the child and one parent. No siblings please; we do not have the room. The children will receive the *Sacrament of Penance* February 13 or 15 at 6:30pm in St. Mary Church.

The forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism is conferred by a particular sacrament called the sacrament of conversion, confession, penance, or reconciliation. To return to communion with God after having lost it through sin is a process born of the grace of God who is rich in mercy and solicitous for the salvation of men. One must ask for this precious gift for oneself and for others.

The spiritual effects of the sacrament of Penance are:

- 1. Reconciliation with God by which the penitent recovers grace
- 2. Reconciliation with the Church
- 3. Remission of the eternal punishment incurred by mortal sins
- 4. Remission, at least in part, of temporal punishments resulting from sin
- 5. Peace and serenity of conscience, and spiritual consolation
- 6. An increase of spiritual strength for the Christian battle



### Third Week of Advent Love Came Down in Bethlehem

We are a people who live in a time almost total dedicated to the concept of power, especially to run all our machines, from cars to computers. Power is a watchword of our time. But what is the most powerful force in the

world? What is the strongest force on earth? Is it military might or political clout? Is it influence or money or position? How would you answer that question? The Bible says it is love. In our modern world, we give so much time, energy, and effort chasing after the wrong kinds of power; and then along comes Christmas. We find Bethlehem, which calls us back to the power of love.

The world teaches us that we can find power in position and fame and money, and this is true to a degree. The problem is, the power associated these things is fleeting and doesn't last. Leaders will come and go, fads will flourish and fade, military establishments will rise and fall; and money can buy many things but not one extra minute of a person's life. But God's truth and love will remain because love is more powerful than all of these.

God's love came down in Bethlehem when Christ came to us in this world in the power of love. The Word of God became flesh and blood and was wrapped up in a person named Jesus, who came and dwelt among us full of grace, full of truth, full of love. He could have chosen the way of might or clout or fame or wealth or force; but instead, he chose the way of love. He came to live in love, the most powerful force in the world, that we might live meaningfully.

There is a quote about the power of love by Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a paleontologist and priest: "Someday, after mastering the winds, the waves, the tides and gravity, we shall harness for God the energies of love, and then, for a second time in the history of the world, man will have discovered fire."

Focus for the Third Week of Advent
We find Bethlehem when we discover the strength
and power of love given to us through Jesus. This
week look for ways the power of love is at work in
your life. Consider how you might demonstrate
love in your words and actions to others.

### Advent Prayer

O God, help me to see and to believe that love is the most powerful force in all your creation. Help me to find ways, day by day, to love others as you love us. In Christ, I pray. Amen


