



humble, more holy, more happy and more full of God.


Your gifts to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul helped those who are poor and suffering to find Emmanuel and they also came to know that "God is with us."

Fourth Week of Advent The Precious Memories of Christmas

If I were to ask you to name your favorite Christmas memory, what would it be? Would it be the memory of your mother baking Christmas cookies or your dad making a stand for the tree? Would it be the sound of a favorite carol or the fragrance of evergreens

in your home?

Christmas memories! No other season, no other time of the year touches our hearts quite like Christmas. They stir our souls! If you stop to think about it, memory is a wonderful gift God has given us. It's the way we learn and the way we celebrate and is absolutely crucial for our sense of personal identity. The ancient Hebrews and early Christians were aware of the importance of memory, which is why we have seasons and traditions, festivals, symbols, colors, and special days. All of these traditions remind us of who we are and whose we are.

Christmas evokes powerful memories and with good reason. That's precisely what it's supposed to do, what it's designed to do. That's why we have it. Christmas reminds us that God cares for and watches over us. It reminds us about the real priorities of life sch as love, joy, peace, justice, goodness, kindness, goodwill, grace, forgiveness, and the importance of family and friends and church. Above all, it reminds us of what God is like and what God wants us to be like. Once each year, Christmas comes around to remind us of the things that truly matter.

Christmas also reminds us that we need a Savior. God sent the Son to save us, change us, and show us a better way. No matter what circumstances we find ourselves in, we can count on the good news that we do not have to be afraid. We have a Savior in Jesus. And, every time we reach out to help others in the spirit of Christ, every time we show kindness in the spirit of Christ, we are sharing that Savior. We are living the spirit of Christmas.

Focus for the Fourth Week of Advent

We find Bethlehem when we remember that Jesus Christ was born to save us and that he reveals who God is and who we can be. During the week ahead, identify ways to help you remember what God says to you through the birth of Jesus. Take time to listen to music, create art, read the Bible or other devotional material, or simply be quiet so that you can remember who God is and how God reveals God's love and salvation through Jesus.

Advent Prayer

Loving and saving God, help us to remember the reason for Christmas. Help us to remember that we need a savior and that we have a Savior. Help us love so that others will know the Savior too. In Christ we pray. Amen.




