



Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.



Dear Friends in Christ,

Welcome to Advent, a time of preparation and reflection. Wonderful! It really depends on who is asking the question. If it's Fr, Martin then the preparation and reflection is all about Jesus, but if it's a work colleague – don't talk to me. I must get a new tree, new decorations, new lights and my brother just got a new baby, so that's another present. My sister moved into a new home, so I must host Christmas dinner this year – I know what I'm preparing for! For some of us the Advent period can develop into a nightmare – don't let it. You decide what you can do and just do it. Learn to say no

to the endless demands of others and come and reflect with God. Here are 6 suggestions for Advent, I hope they are helpful:

#### Read to feed your soul

Be intentional about what you read this Advent, taking a break from novels and biographies to concentrate on books that feed the soul.

- ♦ "The Meaning Is in the Waiting," "The Advent of Christ: Scripture Reflections to Prepare for Christmas," or "Sacred Reading for Advent and Christmas 2025," by the Apostleship of Prayer, the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.
- ♦ To more spiritual inspiration news feeds online like **Busted Halo's Praying Advent** website, or this <u>blog post</u> from the Rev. Dr James A. Kowalski

#### Meditate on being patient

This year focus more on the spiritual meaning of Advent, on the significance of waiting actively in anticipation of Christ's birth. There are many Advent meditation books available, including "Waiting for Christmas" by Fr. Richard Rohr or "Watch for the Light" by Dietrich Bonhoeffer and others. You could also use a YouTube meditation like the one from Pope Francis. Follow a mini-study course like Stephen Cottrell's "Do Nothing Christmas Is Coming" or use Busted Halo's Advent Surprise Calendar with daily inspiration and challenges for a more spiritual Advent season.

#### Pray daily

We all need God's help to slow down and wait with patience. Using the thoughts and ideas based on our prayers, I can ask for God's help to see how he is breaking into my life and pray for others who need his help and healing at this time of year.

#### Reach out to others

While Advent is a time for inner reflection, focusing solely on ourselves tempts us to neglect our call to be good neighbours. St. James spoke very directly about how our faith must ultimately result in action: "Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." Turning our inward Advent reflections into outward actions shows that God is truly working in our lives.

#### Plan with intention

With a little intention, we can learn to focus on God as we do these necessary tasks by praying for the recipients of each gift we wrap or making a mental list of the things we're grateful for while standing in a long line.

#### The Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession

Allow yourself to experience the love of God's forgiving grace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession. Christmas confessions at St. Mary Church, Bordentown, Tuesday, December 16, from 7-8pm. Holy Assumption Church, Roebling, Thursday, December 18, from 7-8pm. Confessions are also heard before the vigil masses every Saturday in both worship sites.

Go on, have a wonderful Advent, you're worth it!

Advent is a time of waiting in the darkness. Try to be patient with the waiting times in your life, as Mary and Joseph waited for the birth of Jesus. As your family prepares for Christmas, keep Jesus in your mind and heart, as they did.

#### **MASS ATTENDANCE**

Mass attendance with your children is essential each week and on Holy Days of Obligation. Our Religious Education program is a partnership between the Church and parents to help raise children in the Catholic faith. Bringing your children to Mass regularly allows them to see, hear, and experience the faith they are learning about in the classroom. The Eucharist is the heart of our Catholic life — where we come together as a community to worship, give thanks, and grow closer to Jesus. By attending Mass as a family, you give your children the greatest gift: the experience of God's presence and love.



Let's just admit it: Christmas for many people means uproar, busyness, and wild confusion. It is absolute bedlam! Frayed nerves, emotional tensions, physical exhaustion, unpaid bills, long lines, traffic jams, difficult decisions, and hectic schedules all combine to make the Christmas season a time of busy confusion

for many people. How many times in the next few weeks will we hear people say, "If we can just get through Christmas...?

On the day before Christmas, one family was at wits' end. The father and mother were frazzled from too much work and too many bills. They were on the verge of nervous breakdowns. Their young daughter felt like she was in the way. They had fussed her and at each other all day long. We can almost understand why, with the frustrations of the day weighing down upon her, the little girl got her words mixed up in her bedtime prayer and said, "Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our Christmases, as we forgive those who Christmas against us."

Christmas or confusion, Bethlehem, or bedlam: Which will you choose this year? The truth is we don't have to choose, because Christmas always happens right in the midst of our confusion. God breaks into our confusion and becomes known through Jesus Christ. Christmas and confusion: weren't they intimately related at the first Christmas when Jesus was born? Sometimes in our Christmas routines it is easy to forget that.

#### Focus for the First Week of Advent

Finding Bethlehem means discovering the good news that in the birth of Jesus Christ, God meets us where we are, even in the midst of bedlam. Each day this week, identify one way you experience the love and support of God as you look forward to celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. Offer a daily prayer of gratitude for God's presence in all areas of life.

#### Advent Prayer

God, you offer yourself to us in all of life, even in the bedlam, confusion, and chaos that often surrounds us. Thank you. Help us to find Bethlehem, to see Jesus, and to trust that you are with us.

In Christ, we pray. Amen


