



Pope's Prayer Intentions for October 2025 - For Collaboration Between Different Religious Traditions

Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice, and human fraternity.

Dear Friends in Christ,

The readings this Sunday invite us to reflect on faith, perseverance, and humility in our walk with God.

The prophet Habakkuk voices the cry of every believer who has ever felt the weight of injustice and suffering: "How long, O Lord?" He laments the violence and strife that seem unchecked in the world.

Yet God answers not with an immediate solution, but with a call to wait in faith: "The righteous one, because of his faith, shall live." Faith, then, is not an escape from life's hardships but the anchor that steadies us when answers are delayed.

In the second reading, Paul encourages Timothy to "stir into flame the gift of God" given to him. Faith is not static; it must be nurtured, strengthened, and lived out with courage. Paul reminds Timothy - and us - that the Spirit God gives is not one of fear but of power, love, and self-control. In a world where discouragement and doubt often creep in, we are called to hold fast to the faith handed down to us, guarding it with the help of the Holy Spirit.

The Gospel brings this all together with the apostles' request: "Increase our faith!" Jesus responds with a surprising answer. He teaches that even faith the size of a mustard seed can do the impossible. True faith is not about quantity but about trust in God's power. Furthermore, Jesus reminds his disciples that faith is not a bargaining chip with God. Like servants fulfilling their duty, we are called to live our faith with humility, recognizing that all we do is a response to God's grace, not grounds for boasting.

Together, these readings challenge us to a mature faith - one that endures questions and struggles, grows through the Spirit's strength, and serves with humility. Like Habakkuk, we may cry out in the face of suffering; like Timothy, we are urged to keep our faith alive; and like the apostles, we too pray for an increase of faith. Let us trust that God will sustain us, even with mustard – seed faith, as we walk in hope, courage, and humble service.

Blessings for the week ahead.



We look forward to welcoming our 3rd-6th Grade students and families for the first Monday Monthly gathering on October 6th at 6:00pm in the School. While the students are in class, we ask that at least one parent attend the parent gathering, as noted in the registration packet under the parent portion.

CONFIRMATION RETREAT Saturday, October 25th 9:00am-1:00pm

All 8th Graders will be attending our Confirmation Retreat, The Call to Living Your Faith. The retreat is a chance for them to step away from their usual routine and spend time with God. During the half day retreat, they will hear inspiring talks, join in fun group activities, and take time for prayer and reflection. It's a chance to think about what it really means to live as a follower of Jesus in their everyday life. They'll also connect with their classmates in new ways and discover how the Holy Spirit is guiding them personally. This retreat is an important step as they prepare to receive Confirmation and live their faith with courage and joy.

RE ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY REMINDER

Our program is designed to support a learning environment that is free from distractions, where children can focus on their faith formation and catechists can teach effectively without the added responsibility of managing inappropriate use of electronic devices. This policy applies to all students and parents, and is in place to ensure the safety, well-being, and growth of every child in our program. Please carefully review the following guidelines:

- Electronic devices may not be used during class time. Each classroom is equipped with a shoe organizer for students to store their phones at the beginning of class. Alternatively, devices may be placed face down on desks. The catechist will decide which option will be used by the class.
- Cell phones are strictly prohibited in restrooms.
- If a student needs to contact a parent during class, they must first request permission from the catechist and will be directed the best way to handle the call.
- If a parent needs to contact their child during class time, they should reach out to Mrs. Zola. Staff will then retrieve the student from the classroom as needed.
- Earbuds and headphones are not permitted in class at any time.
 Smartwatches must be turned off or used only for basic timekeeping. If a smartwatch becomes a distraction, the student may be asked to turn it off or leave it at home for future sessions.






Teen Youth Group Meeting




