



Pope's Prayer Intentions for October 2025 - For Collaboration Between Different Religious Traditions

Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice, and human fraternity.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today's readings invites us to recognize God's healing power and to respond with faith and gratitude. In 2 Kings 5:14–17, Naaman, a foreign general afflicted with leprosy, is healed after obeying the prophet Elisha's simple instruction to wash in the Jordan River. At first, Naaman's pride resists the humility of the act, but when he finally submits in faith, he is made clean. His healing leads to conversion—a recognition that there is no God but the Lord of Israel. Healing, therefore, is not just physical; it is spiritual. It transforms Naaman's heart from doubt to belief, from self-reliance to worship.



In 2 Timothy 2:8–13, St. Paul reminds us of the faithfulness of God during our trials. Even when Paul is bound in chains, he proclaims that "the word of God is not chained." His perseverance becomes a witness to Christ's own endurance. Paul assures us that if we die with Christ, we will live with Him; if we persevere, we will reign with Him. God's mercy remains steadfast even when we falter. Like Naaman, we are reminded that God's grace is not earned by status or effort but received through faith and obedience.

The Gospel, Luke 17:11–19, brings these themes together beautifully. Ten lepers cry out to Jesus for mercy, and all are healed—but only one, a Samaritan, returns to give thanks. Jesus' words to him, "Your faith has saved you," reveal that gratitude is the fruit of genuine faith. The other nine received physical healing, but only the thankful one experienced the fullness of salvation. Gratitude opens the heart to ongoing relationship with God—it is faith in action.

These readings challenge us to examine our own hearts. How often do we take God's blessings for granted, failing to return in thanksgiving? Like Naaman and the grateful leper, we are called to humility, to recognize that every gift—health, forgiveness, and salvation—flows from God's mercy. True faith responds not only with belief but with gratitude that transforms our lives.

Let us, then, live as people healed and renewed by Christ, always returning to Him in thanksgiving, proclaiming with joy: "The Lord has done great things for us; we are glad indeed!"

CONFIRMATION RETREAT Saturday, October 25th 9:00am-1:00pm

All 8th Graders will be attending our Confirmation Retreat, *The Call to Living Your Faith*. The retreat is a chance for them to step away from their usual routine and spend time with God. During the half day retreat, they will hear inspiring talks, join in fun group activities, and take time for prayer and reflection. It's a chance to think about what it really means to live as a follower of Jesus in their everyday life. They'll also connect with their classmates in new ways and discover how the Holy Spirit is guiding them personally. This retreat is an important step as they prepare to receive Confirmation and live their faith with courage and joy.

RE ELECTRONIC DEVICES POLICY REMINDER

Our program is designed to support a learning environment that is free from distractions, where children can focus on their faith formation and catechists can teach effectively without the added responsibility of managing inappropriate use of electronic devices. This policy applies to all students and parents, and is in place to ensure the safety, well-being, and growth of every child in our program. Please carefully review the following guidelines:

- Electronic devices may not be used during class time. Each classroom is equipped with a shoe organizer for students to store their phones at the beginning of class. Alternatively, devices may be placed face down on desks. The catechist will decide which option will be used by the class.
- Cell phones are strictly prohibited in restrooms.
- If a student needs to contact a parent during class, they must first request permission from the catechist and will be directed the best way to handle the call.
- If a parent needs to contact their child during class time, they should reach out to Mrs. Zola. Staff will then retrieve the student from the classroom as needed.
- Earbuds and headphones are not permitted in class at any time.
- Smartwatches must be turned off or used only for basic timekeeping. If a smartwatch becomes a distraction, the student may be asked to turn it off or leave it at home for future sessions.

The mysteries of the Rosary guide us through the lives of Mary and Jesus, allowing us to meditate on events in the life of Christ. Because the mysteries are such a key part of the Rosary devotion, they are important to understand in order to enter into prayer in the most fruitful way.




