

Pope's Prayer Intentions for October 2025 - For Collaboration Between Different Religious Traditions

Let us pray that believers in different religious traditions might work together to defend and promote peace, justice, and human fraternity.



Dear Friends in Christ,

This Sunday's readings from Exodus 17:8–13, 2 Timothy 3:14–4:2, and Luke 18:1–8 reveal a profound truth about perseverance in faith—remaining steadfast in prayer, in God's word, and in doing what is right even when the battle is long or the outcome uncertain.

In Exodus, Moses stands on a hill overlooking the battlefield as Joshua leads the Israelites against Amalek. As long as Moses keeps his hands raised, the Israelites prevail; when his arms grow weary and

fall, they begin to lose ground. With the help of Aaron and Hur, who hold up his hands, Moses sustains the gesture of intercession until victory is won. This image of Moses—tired, upheld by others, steadfast in prayer—beautifully symbolizes the power of communal perseverance. Faith is not an isolated endeavor; it requires the support of others to remain strong. When our spirits weaken, the prayers and encouragement of the faithful help lift us back up.

Paul's words to Timothy continue this theme of endurance. He urges Timothy to "continue in what you have learned and firmly believed," to draw strength from the sacred Scriptures and to proclaim the word "whether it is convenient or inconvenient." Perseverance in faith means holding fast to the truth even when society, comfort, or fear tempt us to give up or compromise. Like Moses, Timothy is called to keep his arms of faith raised—sustained by the Word of God and the witness of the community.

Finally, in Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who refuses to give up seeking justice from an unjust judge. Her relentless persistence moves even the indifferent to act. Jesus uses her story to teach that disciples must "pray always and not lose heart." Prayer is not about wearing God down; it is about transforming our hearts so that we remain open, faithful, and hopeful despite delay or discouragement.

Together, these readings call us to a faith that endures through struggle—a faith upheld by prayer, Scripture, and community. Whether we are raising our arms in prayer like Moses, proclaiming the Word like Timothy, or crying out for justice like the widow, we are reminded that God's response may not be immediate, but it is certain. Faith that persists will always find its victory in God's time and in God's way.

Please be assured of my prayers and may you always feel God's closeness in your heart.

Dear friends, no doubt you are all aware of the peace deal that was signed in the Middle East that has helped to silence the bombs and bullets between Israel and Hamas, let us pray that this tentative peace will become a permanent fixture so that all people in living in Palestine and Israel may live in peace and prosperity.

God asks us to pray for others. Students will receive a pack of envelopes in which they are to sit down and give intentions from their heart before the mass and drop the envelope in the collection basket. They are to look toward heaven, as they appeal to Him. Prayer, at its heart, is an act of faith, asking God to step in and believing that He is both willing and able to listen to us.

How do you write prayer intentions?

- * Tell God your problems.
- * If you are praying to thank God, try writing something like this: "I am thanking you because and I am grateful, Lord."
- * If you are praying to ask for forgiveness, write something like this: "I come to you with sorrow, asking for your forgiveness.
- * Print the name of a loved one or intention on a memo size paper.

THE GIFT OF MUSIC IN OUR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our Music Co-Coordinator, Tina Fernandes, has now visited all of our Religious Education sessions, sharing the beautiful gift of music with every student. During each session, students learn and practice the opening and closing hymns sung at our 10:00am Mass.

These musical moments do more than teach songs—they open hearts. Through music, our students discover another way to pray, to express joy, and to grow closer to God. Singing together reminds them that faith is not only something we learn, but something we live and celebrate.

Bringing music into the classroom also helps our young people feel more connected at Mass. When they hear familiar hymns, they recognize their part in the larger worshiping community and participate with greater confidence and enthusiasm. The joy they bring in song enriches our liturgy and strengthens our shared faith as a parish family.

As St. Augustine reminds us, "He who sings prays twice." Prayer comes from the soul, and singing engages our whole being—heart, mind, body, and voice. Through song, we truly pray with body and soul, and in doing so, draw one another closer to Christ.


