



Another glass of wine, just one more episode on Netflix, a little more scrolling on Instagram women are numbing out at ever-increasing

rates. What is it about our lives that makes us feel so overwhelmed? What might change if we figured out how to build lives that we like?

Walking with Purpose (WWP) may be the answer you are looking for but didn't realize it. It is a unique Bible Study Program for women of all ages. At the heart of the program, we seek to elevate our knowledge of God and to deepen our relationship with Jesus.

WWP is more than a women's Bible study. It is a faith community that supports, encourages, and challenges one another. It is a safe place where you will discover authentic friendships and meaningful discussions as your heart is transformed by the Word of God. It is everything you need to get back to living a life that you love.

This season, we will be studying the book entitled "Grounded in Hope". This study is based on the book of Hebrews, and will help you encounter Jesus in such a powerful, comforting, and stabilizing way that He can become your lifeline.

Mary, Mother of the Church Parish Bereavement Ministry Program



Our Ministry is modelled on the Renew International's. Grieving the Death of a Loved One.

We offer a welcoming and safe place for everyone who joins us, one where there is no specific timeline for your grief. We offer an environment that is free of judgement and where each person's grief can be witnessed with enormous love, support, empathy, and validation from a community of grievers who share that common experience of loss with you.

Each session of our Program incorporates prayer, scripture readings, beautiful healing music, and reflections that can help you tap into your feelings and what you are experiencing in your own journey of grief. In many ways, when we share our story of grief with one another, we find the path to acceptance and potentially even new meaning in our lives.

FALL 2025 PROGRAM SCHEDULE

Our program, presented by trained and Certified Bereavement Facilitator is a six-session program with fellowship on the seventh week. Our sessions will be held every Wednesday beginning September 17th through October 29th. Afternoon and Evening sessions are planned. Afternoon sessions will be held from 2:00—3:30 and evening sessions will be held from 6:30—8:00.pm. Meetings will be held at St. Mary's School, 45 Crosswicks St., Bordentown NJ 08505.

9/17 Session 1: The Search for Acceptance: Beginning the Journey
9/24 Session 2: Bumps Along the Way: The Emotional Journey
10/1 Session 3: Is This the Right Road: Adjusting the Journey

10/15 Session 5: The Search for Connectedness: The Continuing Journey
10/22 Session 6: The Search for Reconciliation: Does the Journey End?

The Dignity of Life Ministry is a part of a powerful movement that uplifts, supports and defends the inherent worth of every individual from conception to natural death.

We stand firm in our commitment to affirm the sanctity of life at all stages. Whether advocating for the unborn, the elderly, or those living with disabilities, this ministry focuses on human dignity ensuring that every person is treated with respect and love.

We are trying to shape a compassionate community by participating in pro-life activities such as praying "40 Days for Life" September 24th thru November 2nd. We will be joining with the Altar/ Rosary Society in praying for unborn children on the Feast of the Rosary (October 11th at Holy Assumption) and planning a Respect Life Mass (October 18th at St. Mary's). We attend the state Mass and March for Life(September 25th at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption). We attended the Bishop's Mass for life and Life Expo (January 24).

We practice faith in action by reaching out to our homebound parishioners and our Diocese seminarians. We touch base with those recently bereaved to see if there is anything that our parish community can do to help.

As a part of the Burlington County Diocesan Respect Life Committee, we share information and pool resources with other parishes.

Deeper relationship with God: Spending time in Eucharstic Adoration provides an opportunity to cultivate a deeper and more intimate relationship with God, particularly through focusing on the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.



Spiritual growth and strength: Adoration can foster spiritual growth, leading to increased awareness of God's love, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and a greater understanding of faith. It can also strengthen one's resolve against temptation and lead to a more virtuous life.

SEVEN BENEFITS OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

Peace and rest: Spending time in silent adoration can bring a sense of inner peace and rest, and may even be associated with a "relaxation response" in the body.


Guidance and clarity: In the quiet presence of the Blessed Sacrament, individuals may experience clearer guidance and a renewed sense of purpose and direction in their lives.

Intercessory prayer: Adoration offers a powerful opportunity to pray for others, for the needs of the Church and the world, and to offer intentions before the Eucharistic Lord.


