
Dear Parents and Confirmation Candidates,

What is the Sacrament of Confirmation?

The Sacrament of Confirmation is the strengthening and fullness of the Holy Spirit already received in Baptism. When we were baptized we became children of God. As children of God we share the life of God; the life of three persons in one love. The Spirit is the love between Father and Son. The Spirit acts in us urging us to move beyond our individual selves into making the community on Earth like the community of love that is God. Confirmation calls us to a greater participation in the mission of Jesus and the Church. Through Confirmation our relationship with God is deepened and we are incorporated more completely into the body of Christ. Confirmation obliges us, as true witnesses of Christ, to spread and defend the faith by word and deed.

Confirmation Candidate Required Responsibilities

Based on the guidelines published by the Diocese of Trenton, the following requirements must be met by all candidates before receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at Mary, Mother of the Church Parish.

All Candidates must assume the responsibility of completion of all parts of preparation and program obligations listed below.

- Attend Sunday Mass, Holy Days of Obligation and pray daily.
- Attend ALL classes and fully participate in open discussions.
- Attend all required meetings, retreats and Catholicism 101.
- Know the teachings of the Catholic faith, the Church precepts and formal prayers.
- Complete at least 30 hours of Community Service, including at least 10 in parish.
- Attend the Diocesan Youth Conference (DYC) February 3, 2024.
- Complete all paperwork on time:
 - Agreement of Parent/Guardian and Sponsor
 - Rite of Enrollment
 - Choosing of a Christian Name (Saint's Name)
 - Draft and Final Letter to Fr. Martin O'Reilly, Pastor
 - Report on Service Activity once 30 hours have been completed
 - Confirmation Application and preparation fee (handed out in spring)
- Participate in parish community life by participating at Mass, attending functions offered throughout the year and as listed on the RE Calendar.
- Exhibit appropriate Christian behavior at all times.

CHOOSING A SPONSOR

- A sponsor is a person who knows the candidate and can help them on their spiritual journey.
- Ideally a sponsor is someone who already has been involved in the spiritual formation of the candidate, such as a godparent, relative or member of the local parish.
- When possible a Baptismal godparent should be chosen in order to continue to guide the relationship between Baptism and Confirmation.
- A sponsor needs to be acquainted with their responsibilities and given opportunities for inclusion in the candidate's immediate preparation program.
- The sponsor is one who is willing to share their with the candidate.
- The sponsor is to be a person of strong and committed personal faith.
- The sponsor needs to be a honest, caring, committed and encouraging person who will help the candidate grow in their understanding of the faith as the young person comes to a deeper appreciation of God in their life.

I have chosen you to guide me on my path to Confirmation.

ELIGIBILITY TO BE A SPONSOR

(According to Church Canon Law and Diocesan mandates.)

For a person to be eligible to be a sponsor:

- Must be 16 years of age and fully initiated in the Catholic Church.
- Must belong to the Catholic Church and have received Baptism, First Holy Communion and Confirmation.
- May be a godparent from Baptism.
- May not be the child's parent or stepparent.
- If married, must be in a valid Catholic marriage.
- An active and practicing member of the Church.
- Must not be prohibited by law from exercising the role of a sponsor.

If your sponsor is not a member of Mary, Mother of the Church Parish please ask them to contact their Parish for a Sponsor Certificate or Letter of Eligibility from their Pastor with the Church seal. Please attach the Certificate/Letter to this agreement or have their Church mail directly to our RE Office. If they are mailing it directly to us, please be sure that they include the word Confirmation and your name for reference. (see below)

SUGGESTIONS FOR SERVICE PROJECTS Corporal Works of Mercy

WHAT ARE SERVICE HOURS? They are hours spent sharing your love of Jesus Christ with others who may or may not be as fortunate as you are. It is your opportunity to show that you believe in Jesus and what He taught us by your actions and deeds. It is your responsibility to preform 30 hours of community service, 10 within our parish. What gifts or talents do you already have? What would you like to do to help others? Below is just a list of suggestions, think outside the box.

Assist a needy family

Assist neighbors with chores or lawn care

Do volunteer work in a hospice

Help with a fund raising project for charitable organization

Help neighbor in need

Initiate a "cleanup" campaign (parish, school or park)

Make gifts or favors for hospitals or nursing homes

Make rosaries (contact RE Office)

Organize or help with a recycling project

Parish events

Perform special services for the handicapped

Prepare a meal or dessert for a family whose suffered a death

Prepare entertainment or holiday parties for nursing homes

Raise money for retirement funds for elderly religious

Read to or make audio tapes for the blind or elderly

Serve as an aide in RE classes (not during your class time)

Shop for an elderly neighbor (nonrelative)

Tutor after school

Visit the elderly at home or nursing home

Volunteer to read at a Book Store or Public Library

Volunteer to work in a hospital

Volunteer in our Food Pantry

Work in a special education program

Write cards or letters to hospitalized children or teens

Vacation Bible School decorate or volunteer for the week

Parents/sponsor consider staying with our child for safety purposes if you don't know the people involved. Ask if the service project has a VIRTUS, NJ CAP, or other Child Abuse Awareness Program affiliated with it, as this will help you decide if it is safe to leave your child.

WHAT DO I DO AFTER I'VE COMPLETED MY SERVICE?

After your service has been completed, you must email Mrs. Schulz with follow up including date, hours, contact name and email, what service you performed, how you felt about it, and would you want to do this service again?

Choosing of a Christian Name

Many people choose an additional Saint's name at Confirmation. The preferred name, however, is the baptismal name because it expresses the relationship that exists between Baptism and Confirmation.

If the Baptismal name is not of a recognized Saint, a new name should be chosen for Confirmation. If a new name is taken, however, it should be the name of a recognized Saint of the Catholic Church.

Names of Saints are chosen to serve as PATRONS and MODELS for those being confirmed. When choosing a patron's name, Candidates should choose a name not because of the attractiveness of the name, but because of the attractiveness of the Christian life that person led.
